A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

Hopefully you survived your turkey feast and the turkey did not! Now Advent begins.

Strangely enough, Advent starts with more of the apocalyptic narrative from the last few weeks. This is in part because we start by reflecting on the three comings of Christ, that is, at the second and final glorious coming, at His first coming at Christmas, and at His coming in each Eucharist. For each we are invited to watch and wait with hopeful expectation and our 24 hours of Adoration are a great expression of this. So consider joining us this Tuesday and Wednesday. I would certainly welcome more company at 3:30 AM. It is a beautiful hour to pray. The Lord does not disappoint when we make space for Him in our hearts and lives.

This week is a great opportunity to go to Confession with a number of priests on Tuesday afternoon from 4:30-6:30 PM. This is a great way to heed the warning of the Lord in our Gospel this Sunday so that in our drowsiness from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life, we may not be caught off guard when He comes.

A final piece of advice for this Advent season would be to encourage you to consider reading one chapter of the gospel of Luke each day in the season of Advent. The Chosen People looked to

the Scriptures for hope and inspiration as they sought to understand the will of God. Our age should be no different. For the Word of God stands as a testament to His activity in our world and His plan for our salvation. Cut out some of the Netflix or new media or football, and make the time for Christ. I have never been more convinced of how necessary it is.

I would also like to remind you about our Core Values or critical behaviors that will make our parish continue to grow and come alive. One of these is **Welcoming Arms: On the Lookout**. We must always be asking ourselves if we are being present to others in our parish. There are always new faces and it is part of our entire parish to be the welcoming presence of Jesus Christ. If we rush in and out of Mass as if this is a one stop shop, we are doing the faith wrong. If we only talk to the people we know before or after Mass, we are doing this faith wrong. If we only drop by the parish when we need something, we are doing this faith wrong. This is a family and just as when someone marries into the family, they are hopefully received with open and loving arms, how much more in the family that is the Church. A few penetrating questions can help ascertain if each of us have been living this Core Value well in the last months:

1. Have you met someone new at the parish in the last months and learned something about them?

2. Have you invited someone who does not regularly come to Church to come to Mass with you or to another parish event?
3. Have you come to any parish event or activity outside of attending Sunday Mass?
4. Have you reached out to a neighbor or friend that you know who has stopped practicing their Catholic faith or perhaps have never been to a church before?

These are all good questions to ponder. Part of my work on Sunday as Pastor is to focus not on the administrative tasks of the parish and answering questions about parish management but pastoral presence. That is, speaking and blessing and praying with new and old parishioners who need a touch of God's grace. Please keep that in mind when you see me as at times we can forget this. This is my role on Sunday. I want to pray with people and meet and speak with new and returning Catholics. If we all keep this in mind I do believe our parish will be more fruitful. I would encourage all of us to be more intentional about living this Core Value of Welcoming Arms, especially on Sundays, so we are more known for the hospitality of Jesus Christ, whose charity we are called to imitate.

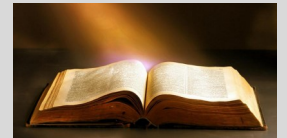
