A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

I depart this week to Chicago for some ongoing studies. I will be gone from November 4 to the 14. While I am gone Deacon Ray will assist, so there will be Adoration on Tuesdays from 5 to 6:30 PM and Thursdays from 5:30 AM to 5:30 PM. But there will not be Mass or Confessions during the week. Archbishop Jackels will be here November 9 and 10 to hear Confessions on Saturday and celebrate the weekend Masses on Saturday evening and Sunday.

Also, I have been working with a number of parishioners on assessing and discerning the Clear Path of Discipleship in our parish. We have met a couple times over the last couple months to assess all of our different ministries and activities and specific things should be on the Clear Path.

The Clear Path involves places for the following:

- 1. Relationship building and growing trust (Connect)
- 2. Conversion and decision for Christ (Encounter)
- 3. Growth and development as a disciple (Grow)
- 4. Formation in evangelization and making disciples (Thrive)

We also identified names for each of these. They are in parentheses.

We have recognized so far that certain things are on this Clear Path. For Encounter, that includes **Foundations of Faith and Discovering Catholicism**. For

Grow, that includes **Small Groups and Following Christ/Sharing Christ**. For Thrive, that includes **Discipleship Quads**. You will notice our bulletin board and website and eventually our bulletin all reflecting this emphasis on the Clear Path as well.

These steps along the Clear Path follow the Thresholds of Faith by Sherry Waddell, who speaks of how people go from not knowing Christ to becoming a faith-filled disciple. These are the following:

Trust: A person has a positive association with Jesus or an individual Catholic and may begin asking questions out of passive curiosity.

Openness: A person admits to a general need or desire for personal spiritual change. This is not the same as a commitment to specific changes. **Seeking:** A person moves from being passive to actively seeking to know the God who is calling him or her. The seeker is engaged in a spiritual quest. **Decision**: The decision, in faith, to follow Jesus as an obedient disciple in the midst of the Church, which brings about new life.

Beginning Disciple: A person has committed to following Jesus by turning away from sin, and makes any sacrifice in order to personally grow, and lives habits of the Christian life.

Missionary Disciple: A person has decided to personally answer the call to take part in the mission of the Church by sharing the Good News. **Fruitful Disciple**: A person is fully

equipped for lifelong Catholic mission

and makes any sacrifice to help another person to grow spiritually.

There is more to this but this is where we have settled so far. There is more than one way to move along the path of discipleship but as a parish we believe these parts listed above will help people to Connect, Encounter, Grow, and Thrive. More to come!

Deacon Ed Pogue passed away peacefully just a year ago on October 31. We continue to feel the loss of this gentle bear in the woods, as his Native American name suggests, and we profoundly miss his pastoral presence in our parish. In our love for him let us continue in our prayers for him.

Also, alongside our ongoing Parish Campus Renovation Project that made some major progress this week, we also had some new fans installed in the Social Hall thanks to the generosity of the Men's Club, YLI, and the Knights of Columbus as well as from our Building Fund. This will keep the cost of cooling and heating down a bit. We also had to replace one of the HVAC units at Sacred Heart Hall recently.

Lastly, the Bishop's Office just informed me that **Bishop Soto** will be coming for our celebration of Our Lady of Guadalupe on December 12, including the procession and Mass in the evening. So make sure to mark your calendars!




