Dear Friends in Christ,

Our own **Deacon Ray Moreno** was recently hired as the new Catholic Chaplain at Mule Creek State Prison in Ione. He started this past week. We are happy to have him a lot closer by, and Mule Creek is certainly happy to have a new Catholic Chaplain since Deacon Fidel left a few months ago. Please pray for Deacon Ray and his new ministry. He will still be quite present here in our parish community as well.

Ann Marie Campbell completed the mural of the three Archangels, and I think she once again outdid any of our expectations. We are thankful for her work and it will be a beautiful treasure for future generations as well. We will bless these images following the 8 AM Mass this Sunday.

There is an event happening in downtown Sutter Creek on Saturday, October 26, called a "Witches Walk." From what I can gather, it finds its inspiration in similar ones in Salem, Massachusetts, and Sandusky, Ohio. Both of them have Wiccan roots and include people who claim to be practicing witches. The dance they plan on performing appears

to have some Wiccan roots as well. For those unfamiliar, Wicca is a form of Western witchcraft. It is nothing to take lightly. To call on anything other than God is to open a door to darkness, whether or not anything enters in. As a parish, we will have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on that day during those hours. This will include from 3 PM to 5 PM before the Vigil Mass and following from 6 PM to 8 PM. You are invited to join us for some time of prayer.

We will celebrate the Rite of Welcome on Sunday, October 27, at the 10 AM Mass for those who are interested in becoming Catholic. We will also be celebrating the Initiation and Confirmation of a number of adults on Sunday, November 17, at the 10 AM Mass. Please pray for all of these candidates. It is always exciting to see the work of the Holy Spirit in the lives of those around us.

I forgot to mention this, but this past week was the gathering of all the priests in the Diocese for Study Days. The main topic of discussion was on mental health, both for priests and for the faithful. I will hopefully be providing

some resources for both our parish staff and parish community in the near future.

This week I am shortening up the reflection from the USCCB on Catholic Social Teaching. The third topic is on the principle of Solidarity.

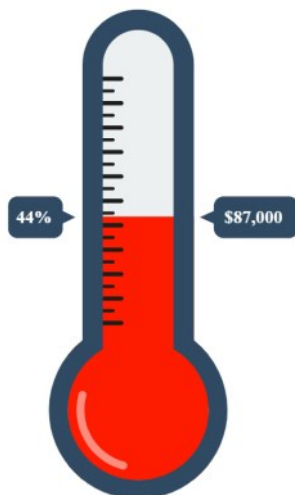
